City of Georgetown Local Condition Weather Statement Winter Weather Warning

Issued February 12, 2010 8:00 AM

This is official information from the City of Georgetown.

The National Weather Service office in Wilmington has placed the City of Georgetown under a Winter Weather Warning until 8:00 AM Saturday Morning.

A winter storm warning means there is good confidence for significant snow, sleet or ice accumulations that will impact the area during the next 24 to 36 hours.

The warning indicates a potential of 1 to 3 inches of snowfall during the warning period with an additional possibility of up to 4 inches of snowfall. The chance of a mixture of rain, snow or ice is also a possibility.

Motorists are encouraged to avoid driving if possible as street and roadway conditions may become slippery and dangerous. Motorists are also reminded that the bridges will likely become slippery before other roadways. Extreme caution in crossing bridges should be exercised.

Residents are encouraged to be careful with heating devices and fireplaces. Overuse can result in a potential for fire.

City Police and Fire crews are always on duty to assist residents with emergencies. While icing conditions that may affect electric lines are not expected, the City's Electric Department will be monitoring conditions to ensure the City's Electric Service remains available to all residents.

Please use 911 only for actual emergencies.

Additional advisories will be issued as conditions warrant.
