City of Georgetown Local Condition Weather Statement Winter Storm Warning

Issued February 12, 2010 12:00 Noon

This is official information from the City of Georgetown.

The National Weather Service office in Wilmington has placed the City of Georgetown under a Winter Storm Warning until 8:00 AM Saturday Morning.

A winter storm warning means there is good confidence for significant snow, sleet or ice accumulations that will impact the area during the next 24 to 36 hours.

Rain later this afternoon is expected to change to snow early Saturday Morning.

The warning indicates a potential of 1 to 3 inches of snowfall during the warning period with an additional possibility of up to 4 inches of snowfall. The chance of a mixture of rain, snow or ice is also a possibility.

City Emergency Management Officials are meeting with Georgetown County Emergency Management later this afternoon for an updated forecast from the National Weather Service office in Wilmington.

Motorists are encouraged to avoid driving, if possible, as street and roadway conditions may become slippery and dangerous. Motorists are also reminded that the bridges will likely become slippery before other roadways. Extreme caution in crossing bridges should be exercised. Additional police patrols have been scheduled to ensure motoring safety.

Residents are encouraged to be careful with heating devices and fireplaces. Overuse can result in a potential for fire. If you have to use candles, please do so carefully. Now is the time to stock up on flashlight batteries and put a fresh battery in your smoke detector.
