City of Georgetown Local Condition Weather Statement Winter Storm Warning

This is official information from the City of Georgetown. The Winter Storm Warning will likely expire naturally this morning

Motorists are encouraged to avoid driving, if possible this morning, as street and roadway conditions are slippery and dangerous. Bridges and most roadways are open however extreme caution in crossing bridges should be exercised.

Residents are encouraged to be careful with heating devices and fireplaces. Overuse can result in a potential for fire. If you have to use candles, please do so carefully.

City Police and Fire crews remain on duty and fully staffed to assist residents with emergencies.

While icing conditions that may affect electric lines are not expected, the City's Electric Department is monitoring conditions to ensure the City's Electric Service remains available to all residents. An outage that effected Willow Bank, the Historic District and Country Club Estates has been restored. If your electrical service is interrupted call 545-4600 for assistance.
