City of Georgetown Local Condition Weather Statement Remnants of Hurricane/Tropical Storm Ida

Issued: November 11, 2009 6:00 AM

This is official information from the City of Georgetown.

The City of Georgetown remains under a Flood Watch as rains from the remnants of Tropical Storm Ida continue to inundate the City.

Storm totals so far indicate the City has received approximately 1.37 inches of rain while the Maryville community has received approximately 2.23 inches of rain.

Flooding of low lying areas has been minimal, so far. However, forecasts from the National Weather Service in Wilmington indicate an additional 2 to 3 inches of rainfall can be expected today. An additional 1 to 2 inches of rainfall is possible tonight, as well.

Residents and motorists are cautioned to avoid driving through water and to avoid flood prone areas during heavy downpours. While street flooding is possible during heavy rainfall anytime, it is more likely around high tide which will occur at 4:35 this afternoon.

Motorists are also cautioned against driving around barricades. Storm Water Personnel place barricades to prevent driving through flooded streets and roadways.
